It is to me a strange neglect that has fallen on the Quaker services and influence on the Colonial life of Newport and of the Colony of Rhode Island and the Plantatations. Among the great facts relating to Newport history the following should be recognized and emphasized. 1. The pre-Quaker movement, illustrated in the leadership of Anne Hutchinson and later that of William Coddington, was a soul-liberty event. 2. The early settlement of Quakers at Newport shows it to have been the asylum of the men and women in search of religious freedom. The execution of Mary Dyer was testimony of their faith in great principles. 3. The fact that Quaker governors, resident of Newport, ruled Rhode Island for more than a century, shows...
